Though it's unclear who made the tools, the find is the latest and most convincing in a string of evidence that toolmaking began before any members of the Homo genus walked the Earth. Related Content That's the conclusion of an analysis today in Nature of the oldest stone tools yet discovered. Up until now, the earliest clear evidence of stone tools came from a 2 6-million-year-old site in Ethiopia.

"This discovery challenges the idea that the main characters that make us human—making stone tools, eating more meat, maybe using language—all evolved at once in a punctuated way, near the origins of the genus Homo," says, a paleoanthropologist at Rutgers University and co-author of the study.
